Charity Walk for 'MIND'

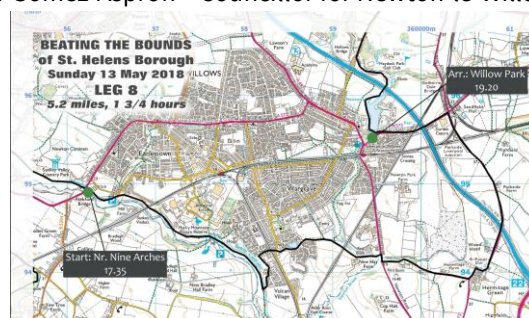

Welcome to our new safeguarding newsletter, which we hope will keep you updated with safeguarding information and school practices.

WHAT IS SAFEGUARDING?

Safeguarding is a term that relates to the action taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm

At the District CE Primary School we ensure that Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and that all staff, visitors, parents and carers understand their roles and responsibilities in keeping children safe.

Safeguarding is defined in the government document "Working together to safeguard Children" (Updated Feb 17) as:

- Protecting children from maltreatment
- Preventing impairment of children's health and development
- Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care
- Taking action to enable all children to have best outcomes.

Safeguarding encompasses everything that we do in school, so that children are safe, well, healthy and ready to learn.

HOW DO WE ENSURE THAT OUR CHILDREN FEEL SAFE?

Throughout our curriculum, we provide activities and opportunities that equip our children to stay safe and develop essential life skills through our focus on core values, developing personal, social and health education and through our programme of assemblies and focus sessions.

Our staff and members of our school council regularly talk to the children, to find out their opinions of school life and how well we keep them safe.
