Focus	To investigate, empathise and enquire. What it means to belong to a community. How people of faith welcome babies. How Christians are welcomed into their faith. Discuss friendships and how these are similar /different to Jesus' friends. Retell/ act out/ discuss and reflect on a range of stories about Jesus' miracles. Ask questions and discuss what the miracles of Jesus teach Christians about him.	To reflect and investigate. For children to reflect upon the miracles of nature and new life. To hear and retell the Easter story. Make links between the transformation of plants and animals and the Easter story to develop an understanding of the Easter Story. How spring is a symbol of new life that represents Easter. Recognise that incarnation and salvation are a big part of the Bible. Tell the story of Holy week making links to the idea of salvation.	To investigate, reflect and interpret. Give children the opportunity to develop their perceptions and understanding of God. Provide an opportunity to reflect on feelings of awe and wonder, delight and mystery in relation to the natural world, the concept of GOD being a part of the CREATION. The feelings you get when you create something new. Retell the creation and know it is the beginning of the big story. Christians believe God created the world.
