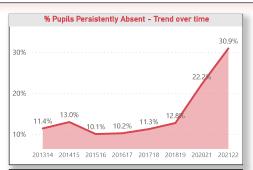

Section: Y1 Phonics Screening Check - % Pupils achieving the expected standard of phonic decoding - 2022/2023 Academic Year

The phonics screening check is a statutory assessment for year 1 pupils (typically aged 6) that confirms whether they have met the expected standard in phonic decoding. All state-funded schools with a year 1 cohort must administer the check. Pupils who do not meet the standard in year 1 or were not checked, must take part in the check at the end of year 2 (typically aged 7). Teachers administer the check one-on-one with each pupil and record whether their response to each of the 40 words is correct. Each pupil is awarded a mark between 0 and 40.

In 2023 as in previous years, the threshold to determine whether a pupil had met the expected standard is 32. Since 2014, this threshold mark has not been communicated to schools until after the screening check has been completed, however its year-on-year stability means it is predictable

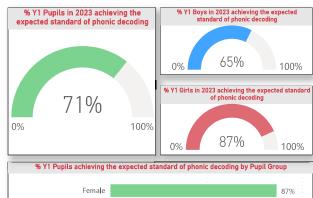

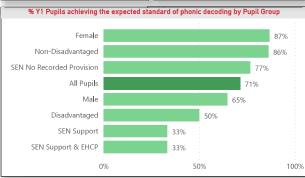

Teacher assessment judgments in reading, writing, maths and science are reported for each pupil at the end of key stage 1 (typically aged 7). Teacher assessments are based on a broad range of evidence from across the curriculum and knowledge of how a pupil has performed over time and in a variety of contexts. Pupils are required to take tests in reading and maths at the end of key stage 1, however teacher assessment is the only data used and reported by the Department for Education.

New key stage 1 assessments were introduced in 2016 to assess the new, more challenging, national curriculum and the expected standard was raised. As a result, figures from 2016 onwards are not comparable to earlier years. Changes to the 2018/19 reading, maths and science TA frameworks mean judgements made in these subjects are not directly comparable to previous years. Changes made within the 2017/18 writing TA frameworks mean judgements in 2018 are not directly comparable to previous years.

% of pupils at the school completing KS1 in the 2022/2023 academic year achieving greater depth





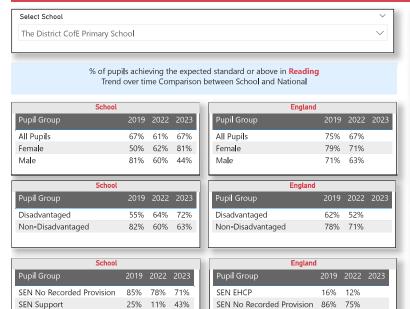

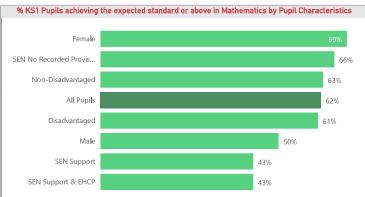

These statistics cover attainment in the following assessments taken by pupils at the end of year 6, when most are age 11, a) Reading test, b) Maths test and c) Writing teacher assessment. Attainment in 2023 is compared to 2022 and previous years where possible. There were no assessments in 2020 and 2021. Tests are used to assess pupils in reading, maths and grammar, punctuation and spelling. Teacher assessment is used to assess pupils in writing and science. In the tests, pupils meet the expected standard if they achieve a scaled score of 100 or

The Department for Education considers meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths to be key for success in secondary school and beyond. Last year, the Department announced a <u>Levelling Up mission</u> for 90% of pupils to meet the expected standard in reading, writing and maths at the end of key stage 2 by 2030.

Section: Key Stage 2 Attainment in Mathematics - 2022/2023 Academic Year



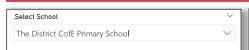

Individual pupil-level progress scores are calculated in comparison to other pupils nationally. For all mainstream pupils nationally, the average progress score will be zero. A school's progress scores for English reading, English writing and maths are calculated as its pupils' average progress scores. This means that school-level progress scores are presented as positive and negative numbers either side of zero.

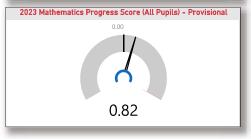
- A score of zero means pupils in this school, on average, did about as well at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A positive score means pupils in this school, on average, did better at KS2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A negative score means pupils in this school, on average, did not make as much progress by the end of KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally. A negative progress score does not mean pupils made no progress, or the school has failed, rather it means pupils in the school made less progress than other pupils across England with similar results at the end of KS1.

For example, a school with a maths progress score of -4 would mean that, on average, pupils in this school achieved 4 scaled score points lower in the KS2 maths test than other pupils with similar prior attainment nationally.

The progress statistics presented on this page are based on provisional 2023 KS2 data and have not been calculated by the DfE and as such represent an interim, early insight into the potential progress scores to be calculated and provided by the DfE to schools in September/October. The DfE figures when provided will also provide associated confidence interval and the school progress scores should be interpreted alongside their associated confidence intervals.
